- Learn to use a range of prefixes and suffixes
- Create suspense and mystery with their writing
- Partake in discussions about specific questions relating to the texts we are reading
- Write setting and character descriptions, stories, explanations and poems
- Form and re-read sentences accurately using success criteria
- Take part in Daily Supported Reading
- Have daily phonics or grammar lessons

So that they...

Verbally articulate their ideas clearly and confidently  
Write and edit descriptive pieces of writing for a range of purposes  
Form coherent sentences with a range of language features  
Apply their phonics knowledge when writing and reading

MusicChildren will:

- To use voices expressively
- To use instruments to help tell fairytales
- To compose and play rhythms

So that they...

Can make changes to their voices to represent a character. Choose a specific sound to represent a specific part in the story.

ArtChildren will:

- Measure out arms, hands and legs
- Mix secondary colours using paint
- Use photos to create silhouettes

So that they...

Create artwork that celebrate human variation and diversity



# Healthy Me

PSHEChildren will:

- Talk about ways to stay healthy
- Discuss the importance of making healthy choices
- Sort foods into healthy and unhealthy foods

So that they...

Know what they need to keep their body healthy  
Can decide which foods to eat to give their bodies energy  
Understand how to use medicine safely

HumanitiesChildren will:

- Recognise that families can share physical traits but also look different from each other or within a family.
- Develop an awareness of the past
- Should know where the people and events fit within a chronological framework

So that they...

Identify similarities and differences between period and ways of life

ScienceChildren will:

- Conduct comparative tests
- Learn about reducing, reusing and recycling
- Investigate water and energy use
- Learn about endangered animals

So that they...

Understand some of the ways our environment is changing  
Carry out simple tests using measuring equipment  
Record and communicate findings from research and simple tests to share with others.

MathsChildren will:

- Measure objects in cm and m
- Comparing and measuring mass, volume and temperature
- Solving problems involving mass and capacity
- Recognise a half, quarter and third
- Recognise three-quarters

So that they...

Compare length, height, mass, and capacity  
Choose and use appropriate standard and non-standard units to measure length, mass and volume  
Practise sharing objects into equal parts and explaining why equal parts matter

Religious EducationChildren will:

- Understand that Easter Sunday follows Holy Week
- Explain why Easter is important to Christians

So that they...

Share a surprise they have had and how it made them feel  
Explain how Easter is celebrated.

Physical EducationChildren will:

- Have weekly outdoor PE lessons and indoor PE lessons to promote health and well being
- Practise controlling a ball with their feet

So that they...

Control a ball and participate in a range of games  
Develop greater stamina and fitness  
Pupils will explore different ways of balancing with a partner and understand which sports require more than one person to balance together to be successful.
