- Learn about what role lines of latitude play in understanding the world's geography, climate, and time zones
- Learn that the northern hemisphere is above the equator. The southern hemisphere is below the equator.
- Learn that we live in the northern hemisphere.

So that they...

- Understand key geography vocabulary and be able to use it correctly.
- Use lines of latitude and longitude to find countries and cities on a map.
- Calculate what the time is in different parts of the world.

DTFastened book covers - TextilesChildren will:

- Know some different fastening types which are useful for different purposes.

So that they...

- Understand how to create a running stitch to fix and decorate textile projects
- Create a book sleeve that reflects their own taste and personality

REWhat does it mean to be Hindu in Britain today?Children will:

- Describe puja and how it shows Hindu faith

So that they...

- Make connections with some Hindu beliefs and teachings about aims and duties in life
- Describe some ways in which Hindus express their faith through puja, aarti and bhajans.

PE

MathsChildren will:

- Learn to count, represent, partition numbers up to 100
- Learn about place value to 3 digits and link numbers in numerals
- Compare numbers using language such as 'greater', 'smaller', 'less' and 'more', using the mathematical symbols <, > and =
- Use knowledge of place value to help complete number patterns
- Learn to add and subtract 10, 100 and 1,000
- Estimate answers and make decisions

- Can calculate more efficiently
- Have a secure strategy for addition and subtraction
- Explore different methods to work out the same answer
- Can be more confident at recalling numbers bonds

ScienceRocksChildren will:

- Make careful observations
- Test the properties of rocks.
- Observe what is in soil
- Explain the process of fossilisation

So that they...

- Compare and group together different kinds of rocks on the basis of their appearance and simple physical properties.
- Describe in simple terms how fossils are formed when things that have lived are trapped within rock.
- Recognise that soils are made from rocks and organic matter.
