<ul> <li>Some of the earliest humans lived thousands of years ago, during the Stone Age</li> <li>At the beginning of the Stone Age, people were hunter-gatherers, which meant they lived in camps and hunted for food</li> <li>Towards the end of the Stone Age, people in Britain began farming. This meant that people could live in settlements, rather than moving around</li> <li>The Bronze Age followed the Stone Age</li> <li>During the Bronze Age, people used stronger tools which were made of bronze instead of stone. They built more comfortable houses</li> </ul>	citadel	An important part of a city. Citadels are usually built on hills and are often protected by high walls.	<ul> <li>The Indus Valley civilisation began over 5,000 years ago</li> <li>It was a Bronze Age civilisation which took place in Asia, in an area around modern Pakistan and India</li> <li>People living in the Indus Valley built large towns using bricks. They were some of the first people to use drains, and they developed ways of writing</li> </ul>
	Harappa	An Indus Valley city. Harappa is an important city because most Indus Valley artefacts come from Harappa.
